Sub : Leave – Granting of unearned leave on Medical Certificate – Exceeding

sixty days – Sanction of – Clarification.

I am directed to state that in the letter first cited, instructions have been issued to the effect that the procedure laid down in Rule 9A under FR-74 (in Annexure-II) Appendix-I of FR) should be followed for sanction of unearned leave on Medical Certificate exceeding 60 days and other cases referred to in the above rules. A point has now been raised that if a Government servant, applies for unearned leave on Medical Certificate for 59 days, avails earned leave subsequently and then again applies in continuation unearned leave on Medical Certificate, the leave applied for may be granted, without reference to Medical Board or it has to be sanctioned only after the recommendation of the Medical Board.

2. The Government had considered the above point carefully and direct that in a combination of leave – say unearned leave on medical certificate, earned leave and extraordinary leave – if the total period of Unearned Leave on Medical Certificate exceeds 60 days eventhough it has been applied for in two different spells with some

other kind of leave in between, the recommendation of the Medical Board should be obtained.

3. Amendment to Rule 9A under FR-74 will be issued separately in this regard.
